PUBLIC HEARING	<p>The Public Hearing is for proposed Bylaws 09-2021 and 122-21 being Bylaws of the Summer Villages of Island Lake and Island Lake South to adopt the Island Lake Intermunicipal Development Plan, respectively. The purpose of this Public Hearing is for the Councils of the Summer Villages to hear testimony and take action relating to proposed Bylaws 09-2021 and 122-31, the Island Lake Intermunicipal Development Plan.</p> <p>Everyone present will be given the opportunity to be heard.</p>																		

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	The Chairman announced the ground rules for the public hearing and the order of speaking.
4. STAFF AND PLANNER PRESENTATIONS	<p>Summer Village of Island Lake Bylaw 09-2021 and Summer Village of Island Lake South Bylaw 122-21 are the Bylaws of the respective municipalities to adopt the Island Lake Intermunicipal Development Plan.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Bylaw 09-2021 was given First Reading by the Council of the Summer Village of Island Lake on July 20th, 2021. - Bylaw 122-21 was given First Reading by the Council of the Summer Village of Island Lake South on July 6th, 2021. - The Joint Public Hearing was advertised by mailing a notice to property owners in the Summer Villages in accordance with the requirements in the Municipal Government Act and the requirements of the Summer Villages. The notification of the Public Hearing was mailed to Summer Village of Island Lake property owners on July 21, 2021 and to the Summer Village of Island Lake South property owners on July 28, 2021. <p>Jane Dauphinee, Planner with Municipal Planning Services, presented an overview of the purpose of the project, the background of the project, the agency notification, the public notification and advertising, and the recommendation (document was attached to the council meeting agenda).</p>
5. PUBLIC TESTIMONY AND COMMENT	<p><u>Written Submissions</u> – none <u>Written Request for Oral Presentation</u> – Ken Stashko</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -confirmed we are reviewing the June 18 Draft IDP -document does not contain description of characteristics of Island Lake (shallow lake, met atrophic, eutrophic) -Statements of best practices and watershed management, but no detail on how it will be achieved (ex: reaction or endorsement or explanation on Minister Order April 2021, shoreline & environmental reserves) -enforcement mechanisms (shall/should/will) <p>Ms. Dauphinee responded:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -took into consideration, reviewed and focused on land rather than the lake (tried to take small steps forward on language between land and lake) -start moving watershed management plan into statutory plan

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	<p>-influence how land is developed going forward -level of detail in the IDP is high, quite deliberately. -Ministerial Order is outside the scope of the IDP Mayor Newton asked if anyone else had requested to speak.</p> <p>MPS – no</p> <p>Mayor Newton if there is anyone else who has not spoken and wishes to speak?</p> <p>No additional inquiries or comments were made.</p> <p>Mayor Newton again asked if there is anyone else who has not spoken and wishes to speak.</p> <p>No additional inquiries or comments were made (nothing in the chat and no raised hand function).</p>
