The Historical Society

The Island Lake Historical Society was started by a group of long term "lakers" in 2002. Their purpose was to preserve the family stories and history of the lake. The end result was the creation of the Island Lake History book "Ripples and Reflections." It was a huge undertaking that took countless hours of volunteer work, but the end result was a book that is highly treasured by many lake families.

The next project of the Historical Society has been the creation of the Memorial Gazebo next to the original children's playground and ball diamond. The Memorial Gazebo was built with countless hours of volunteer time, personal donations, a government grant and council support. It is the wish of members of the Society that the gazebo be a place to honour the lives of those who are no longer here with us physically but whose memories and souls are still here at the lake with us.

There is still some landscaping to finish and some benches to add, but the gazebo is finished! Next the soul of the building begins....placement of individual plaques to honour those "lakers" who have passed on. We are hoping to start taking orders for individual/ family plaques this summer. Development Permits

The Summer Village requires development permits for **all** construction projects. Development permits **must** be posted on the property and be visible from the road. The province of Alberta requires that any construction be completed in accordance with the Safety Codes Act.

You must have permits for all gas, plumbing, heating, electrical and building construction. You also need a permit for any demolition project or any clearing that may affect the contour of the land. No safety codes officer will give you a permit unless they have permission from the municipality. Please contact the village office for a development permit application.

Shoreline Work

All shoreline development work must meet local, provincial and federal guidelines. The federal department of Fisheries is located in Edmonton. They have levied heavy fines and required remedial work at Lake Isle and Pigeon Lake for shoreline work that was completed without permits. All shoreline work requires a permit from Alberta Environment. Please contact the village office for further information.
